

## **DIRECTIVE 2004/38/EC**

# (Free Movement Directive)

# Please note that all documents submitted must be in the <u>original version</u> and translated into French or English

#### Please note that if the application is not complete upon submission, it risks being refused

- Passport valid for at least 3 months after the expiry date of the visa containing at least two blank pages
- Application form completed and signed by the applicant (if minor, signed by parent(s))
- Proof of residence in Morocco for non-Moroccan nationals: Moroccan residence card (or proof of renewal request)
- Copy of the passport identity page of the EU/EEA/Swiss citizen
- Legalized and signed document proving the civil status of the applicant (excluding marriage certificate)
- Proof of accommodation: confirmed hotel reservation, invitation or proof of a package trip
- Ticket reservation (plane, train, bus or boat) for all travel during the requested visa period with or to join a family member from the EU, EEA or Switzerland.

# Proof of being a family member of the EU/EEA/Swiss citizen

### Spouse/partner:

- Legalized and translated marriage certificate / Other supporting documents proving that you are a family member of the EU/EEA/Swiss citizen, if applicable (cohabitation etc.)
- Copy of the civil status document of the EU/EEA/Swiss citizen

# Minor:

- Birth certificate or copy of the record book / legalized court decision on custody of the child indicating the relationship with the EU/EEA/Swiss citizen
- Written authorization from both guardians/parents and copies of their passports and identity cards
- The single parent must prove custody of the child.

#### Additional documents:

In addition to the documents mentioned above, there may be, depending on the situation of the EU/EES/Swiss citizen, additional documents indicating the situation of your family member.

It is generally not necessary to present any other documents, although the embassy strongly recommends that you always travel with a valid travel insurance.

Your family member no longer needs to provide documents proving that your family member meets the criteria for a right of residence in Sweden.

#### N.B:

- The presentation of any false or falsified document may lead to prosecution by legal authorities
- Additional documents may be requested by the embassy
